### **About the Lecture**

China targets its GDP growth at 5% for 2023. Given current challenges to China, such as a sharp fall in foreign trade over recent months, a very conservative outlook of European Economy and the US containment approach to the Chinese manufacturing industry, can Chinese industry and trade be still competitive for global challenges in sustaining its economic growth at or above 5% in 2023 and beyond?

As China's renowned economist and the leading researcher of the macroeconomic research team at Peking University HSBC Business School, Professor Wen Hai will address the question from his analytical view and inside-China observation. His speech on China's economy will be informative, in-depth, and comprehensive in stimulating us to think about the future prospect of China's economy and trade.

## How to get to PHBS-UK:


PHBS-UK's address is: Foxcombe Hall, Boars Hill, OX1 5HR

#### 1. By Car

Easily accessed from the A34, PHBS-UK is a 5-minute drive from the Hinksey Hill Roundabout via Hinksey Hill, a right turn onto Foxcombe Road, and finally turning right onto Berkeley Road.

If you are using a Sat Nav, please enter the postcode OX1 5ET. This will take you to the carpark entrance which is on Jarn's Way.

PHBS-UK has on-site parking and the entrance to the carpark is along Jarn's Way on the left.



#### 2. By Public Transport

#### a. Trains

Trains into Oxford can be found via National Rail: https://www.nationalrail.co.uk/

From the train station to PHBS-UK, due road closures during this period, we would be unable to offer a shuttle bus service directly from the Oxford train station.

Due to limited capacity, the shuttle bus will **only pick up pre-registered participants** from outside the Ashmolean Museum on Beaumont Street. The walk from the Oxford train station to the Ashmolean will take about 12 minutes.

#### b. Taxi from Oxford City Centre

Oxford has 2 taxi companies: Royal Cars: 01865 777333 001: 01865 240000

You can use our postcode, OX1 5HR and let the operator know that you are going to Peking University HSBC Business School – UK Campus on Boars Hill.

For the safety of all our visitors, we recommend using licensed taxis.



#### c. By Public Bus

There are no direct busses to PHBS-UK, but a local bus service (X1) travel from Oxford City Centre to the top of Hinksey Hill. From the bus-stop, it would be a pleasant and scenic 20min walk along Foxcombe Road to PHBS-UK. #### 3. Shuttle Bus from Oxford City Centre

PHBS-UK will provide a free shuttle bus service **only for pre-registered participants** which will run between Oxford City Centre and PHBS-UK at the following times:

Due to the road closures and increased traffic in Oxford during the Bank Holiday Weekend, we ask participants who have registered to take the shuttle bus to be at the pick-up location at least 5-minutes before. The shuttle bus would not be able to wait for participants who are late.

Participants who have missed the earlier shuttle bus could potentially take the later shuttle bus if there are any available space. Priority will be given to participants who have preregistered.
